It makes economic sense

- ☞ Approving the \$13.3 million in bonds provides an orderly way for Lakeway MUD to meet current demand and growth as projected in a new ten-year Capital Improvements Plan.
- ☞ The bond authority allows the Board of Directors to sell bonds as needed, currently planned for 2008, 2012 and 2015.
- ☞ The funds will be used to improve system reliability, safety and security as well as to replace aging infrastructure.
- ☞ Using tax-supported bonds to pay for these essential projects minimizes the impact on your bills.
- ☞ The impact on tax and water rates will be minor, and Lakeway's rates will remain comparatively low.

It makes environmental sense

- ☞ The bonds will pay for water and wastewater pumping improvements, increased water storage, improved pretreatment, better electrical efficiency, interconnection capacity with neighboring utilities and replace 40-year old tanks and pipelines and 30-year old drinking water treatment units.
- ☞ The bonds will also pay for projects that use recycled water for irrigation, thus protecting and conserving our precious lake water.
